We had 166 posters submitted. Based on the results from the peer-review process, 96 research posters (62.7%) and 70 innovative posters were accepted (83.3%).

1. If you choose to have your poster narrative included in the proceedings the final manuscripts must be uploaded to the poster submission site by Saturday, April 26th.

The cover page should contain the following information and be centered on the page—poster abstract title, author name, mailing address, phone number, and e-mail address of the authors. The type of poster should be printed in the upper right-hand corner.

Uploading Poster Abstract Revisions

- 1. Go to the **AAAE Poster Website**.
- 2. Choose the appropriate conference.
- 3. Login
- 4. Select "My Reviews"
- 5. Select a poster submission.
- 6. Select "Upload Final Version for Publication"
- 7. Upload your revised narrative as a PDF. Your narrative must be no longer than 4 pages (cover page, 2-page narrative, 1-page references). You should take this opportunity to add blinded information (such as state or university name).
