Paper Sessions

If you are delivering a paper in a self-designed paper session, no discussant paper session (scholarly or research), or a regular paper session (scholarly or research), you must upload a copy of your full paper for your discussant and chair on the <u>proposal submission site</u> no later than Friday, October 25, 2019 at Noon Pacific Time. Should you not upload a paper by the deadline, your discussant may elect only to give cursory feedback or no feedback at all.

For individuals delivering papers in our new "No Discussant Session" format, you will still need to upload your paper because session Chairs are being asked to facilitate a conversation amongst paper writers and audience members. They will need to have a deeper sense of your papers to facilitate a meaningful conversation. Chairs will not be delivering comments.

Please note that when you upload your paper to the ASHE site, it is not made public; it will only be visible to participants in your

session including your Discussant and Chair.
