Thank you for your submission to the 2026 Southern Region AAAE Poster Session. The review process is complete, and we are pleased to accept your poster *An Introduction to the Three-Circle Model: The Ag Games!*

#### Uploading Poster Revisions

1. Go to the poster site: <https://submission.aaaeonline.org/>
2. Choose the appropriate conference
3. Login
4. Select "My Reviews"
5. Select a poster submission
6. Select "Upload Final Version for Publication"
7. Upload your revised narrative as a PDF. Your narrative must be no longer than 4 pages (cover page, 2-page narrative, 1-page references). You should take this opportunity to add blinded information (such as state or university name).
