We received over 900 proposal submissions for this year's conference, which promises to be a rich and engaging program of research sharing, collaboration and social networking.

You will have seen the announcement earlier this week that the conference will now run online. Given that all conference presentations will be delivered online, we ask that you consider your preference for a synchronous (scheduled into a 'live' session) presentation or a pre-recorded presentation. If you wish to change to a pre-recorded presentation, please let us know at [events@aare.edu.au](mailto:events@aare.edu.au) before 30 July, so that we can account for your preferred presentation format in the program.

We recognise that there are considerable ethics and privacy concerns regarding the sharing of data and sensitive information, which is often a feature of AARE conference sessions. To ensure confidentiality and appropriate ethical engagement with research presentations, please note that no synchronous sessions will be recorded (with the exception of plenary keynotes), and that pre-recorded presentations will only be available during the conference period to delegates.

If you are seeking to submit your paper for consideration for one of the 2021 AARE Conference Paper Awards, please check the [AARE website](#) for further information, including the [online paper submission form](#). Please note the award submission deadline is 31 August 2021.

If your proposal has been accepted for a digital poster presentation, we will be in touch with further information in the coming weeks.

If you have submitted a symposium in consideration of a Featured Symposium session, that the AARE Executive have formed a panel, which is currently giving full consideration to the Featured Symposium applications. Please note that this email confirms your symposium's inclusion in the general conference program. Featured Symposium outcomes will be announced separately in August.

The Special Interest Group Convenors and the Conference Committee will begin programming the conference soon. We hope to have a draft program to share with all presenters during September.

Registrations for the conference will open in early August. You can see the registration rates on the [conference website](#). There are bursaries available this year for concessional registration.

Please visit the [bursary page](#) on the conference website for further information. Bursary applications are due on 3 September 2021.

While the conference will be online this year, we will be encouraging conference delegates to form local 'hubs' across Australia and internationally, and to think about ideas for engaging with each other during the conference. This could include coming together in groups at multiple universities to connect to plenary sessions, share food and ideas during the breaks, and perhaps organising local dinners and social events in towns and cities across the country.

If you find that you are unable to participate in this year's conference, please let us know as soon as you can, so that we can ensure that the program is as accurate as possible.
