1. Course Number: KINE 8900

Course Title: Directed Studies

(Muscle Physiology Lab Techniques)

Credit Hours: 3

Prerequisite: Instructor approval

Corequisite: None

2. Text: None. Various research papers will be used.

- **3. Course Description:** Discussion, investigation, and implementation of techniques used in metabolic studies using the isolated, spontaneously perfused canine gastrocnemius preparation. Practicing techniques, including chemical analyses. There will also be detailed reading and review of scientific articles related to oxygen uptake on-kinetics.
- **4. Course Objectives:** Upon completion of this course, the student will understand:
 - 1. Essentials of the techniques for the canine gastrocnemius plus superficial digital flexor.
 - 2. The basic tenets of the metabolic response to exercise/contractions onset.
 - 3. The role of oxidative phosphorylation and metabolism in the transition from one metabolic rate to another.
 - 4. Essentials of lactate and pyruvate analysis.
- **5. Course Content and Schedule:** The course involves in-depth study of the chosen topic. The student will meet with Dr. Gladden on a weekly basis to a) observe and practice techniques, b) select scientific articles to be read, c) to review and discuss articles that have already been read, and d) to turn in summaries of articles read.

6. Course Requirements/Evaluation:

The course requirements include observing and practicing techniques, reading scientific articles and summarizing/synthesizing them in the form of short essays/abstracts.

7. Class Schedule

Weekly one-on-one discussion/presentation/observation/practice sessions.
