4. Course Description: Opportunities for interns to put into practice knowledge and skills learned during graduate coursework.

5. Course Objectives:

- I. Provide instructor with an initial letter from the supervisor of the student's internship describing briefly the work the intern will perform;
- II. Keep a journal of activities in the internship (in Blackboard);
- III. Arrange, if practicable, for a site visit by the instructor;
- IV. Submit the journal (Objective II above) and a summary of the internship experience. The summary should be approximately five (5) pages in length;
- V. Provide the instructor with an evaluation from the supervisor of the student's internship; and
- VI. Dedicate approximately ten hours of internship activity each week to your assigned unit.

6. Course Content:

Each internship is a unique experience designed cooperatively by the student, instructor and/or advisor, and unit supervisor.

7. Course Requirements:

- I. Letter from the supervisor of the student's internship describing briefly the work the intern will perform.
- II. Keep a journal of activities in the internship to be submitted at semester's end.
- III. Summary of the internship experience. The summary should be approximately five (5) pages in length and is to be submitted at semester's end.
- IV. Provide an evaluation from the supervisor of the internship.

8. Grading and Evaluation Procedures:

The final grade for the course will be based on the following:
