Course Description: Practical strategies and applications for the enhancement of motor development for school-aged children.

Objectives:

Students should be able to...

- Demonstrate knowledge & competency regarding normative & personal developmental milestones & experiences specifically related to motor development.
- Understand the impact of environmental influences & programming on development.
- Generate & implement developmentally appropriate activities during a high autonomy physical play program for children who have been identified at-risk of developmental delay & poor health.
- Gain practical experience in the development of motor skills & perceptual motor development through service learning experiences.

Course Content, Requirements, and Evaluation:

<u>Tell me about yourself</u> (5 points) This assignment is all about you. Answer the questions honestly and openly. This assignment must be typed, name and date placed in upper right corner, using 12 font (Times New Roman), double spaced, and 1inch margins.

<u>Chapter Assignments</u> (55 points): Read chapter assigned each for specific week. **Define** the key terms in the chapters. **Answer any 2** questions given at the end of each chapter. Each assignment should be typed and is due by the beginning of the class period by the due dates below:

Quizzes (50 points) Quizzes (n = 5) are an important component of a successful learning experience in KINE 2250 and will occur over the course of the semester, as scheduled. Quizzes are ten questions (1 point per question totaling 10 points per quiz). Quizzes will be taken independently through Blackboard and students will have one opportunity to complete each quiz. If technical difficulties arise while completing the quiz, email the instructor and adjustments will be made. Missed quizzes WILL NOT be made up. Quizzes are timed and students have 15 minutes complete each quiz.

<u>Out-of-Class Assignments</u> (40 points) There is an out-of-class assignments that is to be completed individually (20 points) and one in a group of two (20 points). Students will briefly discuss each assignment in class.

Project 1 – Understanding my Own Development (Individually)

Project 2 – Playground Evaluation (Group of 2)

<u>Project 3 – Lesson Plan & Movement Activity</u> (25 points) Project 3 involves generating a developmentally appropriate lesson plan (physical play, physical activity, or motor skill activity) for child-driven learning environment. The aim of this project is to create unique, purposeful developmentally appropriate activities that emphasize learning the fundamental motor skills or promoting physical activity while promoting cognitive development (e.g., theme relates to vegetables, colors, shapes, animals, numbers, etc.). *3 students per group*.

Auburn Day Care Service Learning Experiences (25 points) Each student is responsible for completing 5 hours of Service Learning (in a maximum of 90 minutes per visit) at an Auburn Day Care Centers or another approved site (Completed by July 28th). Students will receive 15 points for completing hours and 10 points for Reflection Log.

<u>Pop Quizzes</u> (10 points) A number of unscheduled quizzes will be given periodically throughout the semester. Quizzes will be brief and will cover material previously presented in class. Students are expected to have a good understanding of the material that is being presented in the classroom.

<u>Participation</u> (10 Points) Active involvement class (discussion, group projects, assignment)

<u>Auburn Day Care Application Paperwork</u> (10 points) The Auburn Day Care application paperwork (located within Blackboard "Course Materials") must be turned in no later than May 31, 2011. Failure to complete the paperwork will prevent the student from visiting ADC & will result in loss of allocated points for missed service learning experiences. (Paperwork that is submitted after the due date will result in a 0 for the assignment)

Total Possible Points for KINE 2250 = 230 points.

<u>Grading Scale:</u> A = 90 - 100%, B = 80 - 89%, C = 70 - 79%, D = 60 - 69%, F < 60% (To calculate final grade divide total points received by total possible points. Then multiple by 100)
