For U.S. residents, certain travel restrictions are in effect. Tourist travel to Cuba is prohibited under U.S. law for U.S. citizens and others under U.S. jurisdiction. Travel is permitted for U.S. citizens and others under U.S. jurisdiction who meet the requirements of one of twelve General License categories published at 31 C.F.R. § 515.560(a) (see reverse side).

(3) Journalistic activity;

(1) Family visits

- (4) Professional research and professional meetings;
- (5) Educational activities\*
- (6) Religious activities;
- (7) Public performances, clinics, workshops, athletic and other competitions, and exhibitions;
- (8) Support for the Cuban people;
- (9) Humanitarian projects;
- (10) Travel related to activities of private foundations or research or educational institutes;
- (11) Travel related to the exportation, importation, or transmission of information or informational materials; and
- (12) Travel related to certain export transactions that may be considered for authorization under existing Department of Commerce regulations and guidelines with respect to Cuba or engaged in by U.S.-owned or -controlled foreign firms.

<sup>\*</sup> U.S. persons relying on the individual "Person-to-Person" provision of category 5 must provide documentation for having completed at least one travel-related transaction (such as purchasing a flight or reserving accommodation) prior to June 16, 2017.
