



GLOBAL BRIDGE PROGRAM

With Conditional Admission | May 17 – December 7, 2012

REQUIREMENTS¹

- High school transcript (certified copy and certified English translation) with a minimum grade point average of 2.5 out of 4.0
- TOEFL or IELTS score, if available (Students with a TOEFL score below 500 pBT/61 iBT or an IELTS below 5.5 will find the Global Bridge Program very challenging and may not be able to pass it.)
- A statement from a bank or a scholarship letter showing \$32,460, which is the estimated cost of attendance in the Global Bridge Program for two semesters
- Copy of the passport photo page (and visa, if already in the U.S.)

PROGRAM COSTS

Global Bridge Program Fees:

- Application fee: \$60²
- Summer Tuition and fees: \$12,325
- Fall Semester Tuition and fees: \$12,325 (approximate, pending Board of Trustees' decision)
- Summer Insurance: \$320
- Summer Housing on Campus: \$2,086
- Fall Insurance: \$762
- Campus housing: approximately \$2,000

Additional Costs (Estimated):

- Books and Supplies: \$1,100
- Meals: \$3,086 (meal plans available on campus)

- 15 credits toward an undergraduate degree during the summer semester (9 credits of advanced English language skills and 6 credits of academic courses)
- Full-time transient student status during fall semester (an additional 12-15 credits of academic courses)
- Full-time admission into a degree program in the spring semester, dependent upon satisfactory GPA (2.5)
- Simplified admissions application and fast-track processing
- ACT/SAT score requirement waived with successful completion of the Global Bridge Program
- On-campus housing during the summer session
- A university-town experience with many weekend activities
