## NON-EMERGENCY CONCERNS AND CONSULTATION

<p><b>Personal Crisis/Distress</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Personal tragedy or significant event that may impact a student's ability to stay enrolled.</li> <li>• When multiple issues impede student success.</li> <li>• Concerns about the aspects of the campus environment negatively impacting students.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Auburn Cares</b> Student Center, Suite 1206 (334)-844-1305 Katherine Hettinger, Director aucares.auburn.edu</p>	<p>Auburn Cares will consult with faculty on how to manage the situation and provide students with process navigation, referrals to campus or community resources, and individual case management. A referral form is available on the website.</p>
<p><b>Safety of the Auburn Community</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Questions about issues related to workplace and academic safety and incident response.</li> <li>• Concerns about potential threats posed by students, faculty, staff or campus visitors.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Threat Assessment Team</b> (334) 844-5010 Kelvin King, Executive Director, Department of Campus Safety &amp; Security autat@auburn.edu</p>	<p>The Threat Assessment Team will assess the situation and advise faculty on outreach and educational programming, consultation, and appropriate referrals.</p>
<p><b>Mental Health</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students suffering from severe anxiety, depression or other disclosed mental health concerns.</li> <li>• Suicidal thoughts or emotional disturbances.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Student Counseling and Psychological Services</b> Locations: 2nd floor of the Auburn University Medical Clinic and Ground Floor of Haley Center Doug Hanks, Executive Director 334-844-5123   auburn.edu/scps</p>	<p>Trained staff from SCPS will consult with faculty on how to manage the student's situation. Urgent cases are triaged or referred to off-campus providers, if necessary. Resources include individual and group clinical counseling, psychiatric services, the Zen Den, animal assisted therapy, and eating concerns. A Faculty Staff Guide is provided on the SCPS website.</p>
<p><b>Student Conduct/Disruptive Behavior</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Observed behavior that violates the student code of conduct.</li> <li>• Students are disruptive in class or other off-campus locations</li> </ul>	<p><b>Student Conduct</b> Nick Wiard, Director 334-844-1305 conduct.auburn.edu</p>	<p>Student Conduct will consult with faculty or staff on how to manage the situation. If warranted, an incident report will be requested. A referral form is available on the website.</p>
<p><b>Interpersonal Violence</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students report incidents of sexual violence, domestic violence, stalking, harassment, etc.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Safe Harbor</b> Melton Student Center, Suite 1206 334-844-7233 (24/7 crisis line) auburn.edu/safeharbor</p>	<p>Trained staff provide crisis intervention and safety planning resources as well as information about rights and reporting options. Staff provide medical accompaniment and advocacy and Title IX investigation support and accompaniment. A referral form is available on the website.</p>
<p><b>Other/Not Sure</b></p>	<p>Consult with the associate dean, dean, or the Provost's Office</p>	<p>Assistance with exploring options or resources</p>

\*Behaviors can include misuse of alcohol, disorderly conduct, drug use, theft, hazing, harassment (verbal or physical), threatening behavior, physical assault, vandalism, excessive noise, residence hall visitation, etc.
