THE MEDAL OF THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS. This medal is conferred annually on the architectural graduate who has made the best scholarship record throughout the entire course. It is accompanied by a copy of Henry Adams' great work on Mont St. Michel and Chartres, and is awarded this year to: *Wallace Eugene Treadaway*, Montgomery, Ala.

THE ALABAMA SOCIETY OF ARCHITECTS DESIGN PRIZES. The Alabama Society of Architects offers annually prizes for excellence in design. The amounts are to be used by the winners for the start of a professional library. 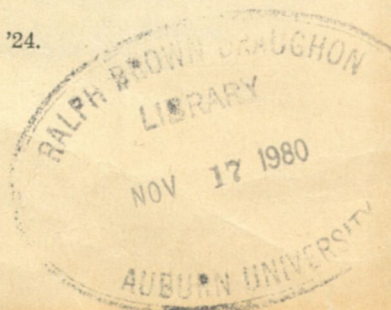
