Dear Provost Nathan and Search Committee Colleagues,

Please consider my letter of interest in response to your posting for Dean for Auburn University's College of Nursing. My leadership experience, personal values, and deep passion for Nursing and health underpin my motivation to pursue your prestigious opportunity.

Leadership Experience

For the last four years I have grown in progressive leadership experiences in a Research I, land grant-mission institution of higher learning. I have completed formal leadership training through national and local programming, am active with the University of Arizona (UA) HeadsUp community, and have developed a praxis of leading over the last 4 years as a program director and interim division chair. My background and experience in shared governance, meaningful and federally-funded research, administrative leadership, and program direction strengthen my developing competence as a chair. In the UA HeadsUp program, I learned strategies for promoting positive culture, managing resources, providing and receiving feedback, and navigating crucial conversations. Additionally, I completed competitively selected training at UA as part of the Academic Leadership Institute in 2023-2024 which built on the three years of leadership training that I completed with the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Nurse Faculty Scholars program.

Research and Scholarship

As a faculty clinician scholar, my contributions to research lie at the intersection of stakeholder-engaged implementation science and informatics to improve care quality. Although my population of focus has been vulnerable neonates, especially those at risk for complications of premature birth (i.e. necrotizing enterocolitis, NEC), my informatics work has spanned populations and contexts. My research and leadership illustrate the essential need to engage stakeholders to shape clinical practice. I built and validated a clinical prediction algorithm, GutCheckNEC, the first NEC early warning score, for timely NEC rescue while showing that NICU practices drove NEC risk. Shifting to prevention, I spawned "NEC-Zero" with a goal to move NEC "to zero" in US NICUs. With funding support from RWJF, AHRQ and NLM, I created a clinical decision support dashboard and a multi-media toolkit to engage parents and clinicians in relevant actions to avoid NEC. In September 2024 we received the notice of award from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (R01) to extend NEC-Zero by using a telehealth delivered mentoring strategy to link experts with local NICU clinicians to embed NEC prevention in clinical care. This work builds on our past relationships, engaging teams from across the US, targets health disparities for NEC, and partners with a large neonatal medical group which provides care for approximately 20% of US NICU admissions annually. To increase impact and drive NEC to zero I worked with national and international groups (NEC Society, PCORI funded NEC symposiums and International Neonatal Consortium) to spread best practice knowledge, standardize care and formalize guidance for practice and research. In 2018, funded by the National Network of Libraries of Medicine, my team disseminated the NEC-Zero toolkit via webinars and multi-media to reach Arizona, New York, Brazil, Los Angeles, Texas, Florida, and Hawaii-spanning all six inhabited continents. In 2024 we learned that our NEC-Zero website was being used as the basis for AI-Copilot recommendations for clinical improvements. Subsequently, we have received international and national requests to use GutCheckNEC. Future funding proposals will leverage AI to expand GutCheckNEC, and separately- to extend the NEC-Zero intervention for newborns with congenital heart disease. As of today, I have 99 published manuscripts and 3300+ citations. Among my publications, over 32 have been cited at least 32 times (h-index of 32) and 74 have been cited at least 10 times.

Involvement and Leadership across PhD and DNP Programs

I have served as PhD director, overseeing a cadre of courses and faculty to deliver PhD education via a hybrid model to our 45-55 active students. I served as specialty coordinator for the DNP informatics specialty until it was closed. As interim chair of the Biobehavioral Health Sciences Division (22-23), I led faculty in the PhD and RN-MS programs. In July 2023 we merged faculty from across our doctoral programs into a single division, which I have led as chair for the last year (interim). As the Chair (interim) for the Advanced Nursing Practice and Science Division, I worked closely with the DNP director/Vice Chair and the Specialty coordinators (CRNA, AGACNP, FNP, PNP, Midwifery, Executive Health Systems Leadership) to deliver an exceptional DNP education experience for students. The DNP program is currently ranked #19 among programs in the U.S. One of our shared activities was to work with Arizona Online to enact more tailored marketing for the DNP program. Additionally, I have taught in DNP courses, served on and led DNP project committees, and participated in the DNP-Curriculum Instruction and Support committee as ex-officio member (2021-2024). During the on-campus clinical immersion experiences for the year I have served as interim chair (2023-2024), I have physically been present and provided support for faculty. Although I am not a nurse practitioner, I have great respect for the role. Further, I believe in the strength of the DNP and worked hard this year to develop a workplace culture that is respectful, inclusive, excellence-focused, and communicates equal value to the doctoral pathways in nursing. My experience working with DNP provides a rich foundation to develop in terms of working across programs.

National/International Reputation

I was promoted to Full Professor with tenure in spring 2022 at the University of Arizona. I was selected as a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing and the Western Academy of Nursing in 2019, following selection by the Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science for Brilliant New Investigator in 2018. In 2023, I was nationally recognized by the National Association of Neonatal Nursing for Distinguished Service. I am deeply thankful for the career development, leadership training, and mentoring I received from 2014-2017 through the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Nurse Faculty Scholars Program. I have provided international invited presentations, worked with colleagues to translate my tools into Spanish, Chinese, and Italian, and have found my tools to be frequently downloaded by NICU clinicians abroad. I have also served at invitation on initiatives through the International Neonatal Consortium. Additionally, tools that I cocreated to examine nurses' experience of electronic health record unintended consequences have been used by groups across the nation (AWHONN, Emergency Nurses Association, VA Health Administration) and informed EHR-quality improvement efforts (Dignity Health, SW US).

Alignment, Commitment, and Summary

My commitment to the mission of nursing education is steadfast and I am grateful to have worked with outstanding people in my role as interim chair. At this time, I am eager to learn from other colleges and faculty and have been impressed with Auburn University's impressive pre-licensure nursing program, faculty, and staff. As interim chair for the last 2 ½ years, I have developed in leadership competency to lead a college prepared to extend our academic nursing workforce. I have personally fostered an environment of excellence, the pursuit of NIH funding among our faculty, fostering of policies to provide greater incentive to seek funding and stay financially sustainable, and shared governance to grow as a college in the midst of much change. My continually growing leadership praxis and competency supports effective strategies to manage conflict, create a positive work culture, give and receive feedback, manage organizational change, sustain career optimism through transition, and continue to show up for one's faculty and staff because they are the center of the academic mission and engine. I look forward to learning more from your leaders and faculty as the process unfolds.

Neonatal Care: Prevention and early recognition of necrotizing enterocolitis (NEC) by engaging clinicians and parents to adopt evidence-based practices and use algorithms to support early recognition, specifically the tool I developed and validated, GutCheck^{NEC}. Outreach to Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICUs) to spread best practice to avoid NEC using Project ECHO (telehealth).

Informatics: Electronic Health Record usability and unintended consequences, spreading evidence-based practices using informatics and clinical decision support. Integration of algorithmic clinical decision support for drug-drug interactions. Telehealth delivered mentoring to boost adoption of necrotizing enterocolitis prevention in NICUs.

Implementation Science: Knowledge synthesis with stakeholder engagement to test implementation, adherence to multi-faceted interventions, approaches to nation-level facilitation and implementation of best practice in NICUs.

Instrument Development: Development and psychometric validation of instruments including a criterion-referenced index (GutCheck^{NEC}), a self-report instrument (Carrington-Gephart Unintended Consequences of EHR Questionnaire) and an adherence score for implementation of evidence-based practices to prevent necrotizing enterocolitis (NEC-Zero adherence score).
