RE: Dean of the College of Nursing at Auburn University

Dear Search Committee,

It is with great excitement that I submit my letter of intent for the position of Dean of the College of Nursing at Auburn University (AU). After thoroughly reviewing the opportunities, expectations, and qualifications outlined for the Dean position, I am confident that I possess the strategic vision and leadership necessary to excel in this role.

In this letter, I summarize the leadership qualities that uniquely position me to elevate the Auburn University College of Nursing (AU CON) to new heights, addressing the nation's healthcare needs through research and innovative education that impact lives.

Additionally, I highlight the foundation of my personal and professional attributes, including my academic qualifications, research and scholarship, teaching and mentoring experiences, clinical partnerships, community engagement, and service.

Leadership Profile

I am a tenured professor and currently serve as Associate Dean and Chief Academic Officer for the School of Nursing in the Byrdine F. Lewis College of Nursing and Health Professions at Georgia State University (GSU). Although my title, based on the organizational structure, is Associate Dean reporting to the college dean, I have been responsible for all aspects of the School of Nursing as Chief Academic Officer since 2023.

In my current and previous leadership roles, I have demonstrated strategic vision, the ability to foster a dynamic academic environment, and a commitment to excellence. For example, as Ph.D. Program Director of Nursing at the University of Texas Health Science Center San Antonio in 2020, I conducted a comprehensive assessment of the program's efficiency and implemented improvements in key areas. Similarly, upon joining GSU, I collaborated with faculty to conduct a SWOT analysis and established strategic goals and action plans. I supported the strategic planning committee to refine processes, align

unit goals with the institution's mission, and ensure responsiveness to emerging trends in healthcare and nursing education.

Upon my arrival at GSU, I quickly employed my leadership skills to guide the School of Nursing through rigorous accreditation processes, including:

- Securing the renewal of the Commission for Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) accreditation for BSN, RN-BSN, MS, and DNP programs through 2033.
- Submitting the Academic Program Review (APR) to the University System of Georgia Board of Regents in December 2024.
- Submitting the executive summary for the upcoming Georgia Nurses Association accreditation visit in 2025.
- Submitting an application for American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) approval for a new continuing education program at GSU in November 2024.

These achievements required collaborative leadership skills, which I will bring to my role at AU CON.

My leadership track record demonstrates a steadfast commitment to advancing academic excellence across undergraduate and graduate programs, as well as to ensuring student success. Under my leadership, the GSU School of Nursing has experienced significant growth in enrollment, expanding the undergraduate program from 76 to 125 students per semester and the master's program from 40 to 78 students within a short period. Recognizing that program growth can pose challenges to maintaining educational quality, I collaborated with undergraduate and graduate program directors to address these concerns. Together, we implemented strategies such as hiring additional instructors and teaching assistants for larger classes and expanding student mentoring programs to support academic excellence.

Additionally, I spearheaded educational innovations, including a pilot project integrating generative AI tools into nursing education in partnership with the Center for Teaching and Learning Excellence. These initiatives have yielded measurable results, including an improvement in NCLEX pass rates from 87% to 97% for the BSN program and from 98% to 100% for the ADN program. An outstanding achievement was the school's rise in ranking by 59 spots according to the US News and World report after a year of my leadership.

I am deeply committed to *faculty and staff development*. At UTHSCSA, I utilized my endowment to support faculty and doctoral students in their travel endeavors, significantly increasing the number of presentations that later resulted in publications. At GSU, I doubled travel funds to support faculty and doctoral students in attending national and international conferences, facilitated career development opportunities for staff, and fostered a culture of recognition and collaboration. Initiatives such as the "Bite & Learn" series and targeted faculty development programs have further enhanced faculty engagement and innovation.

Under my mentorship, five faculty members achieved promotions, one earned tenure, and one staff member was promoted and selected for leadership fellow, demonstrating my commitment to professional growth. Additionally, I have actively sought resources, identified award and recognition opportunities, and provided strong support letters for these endeavors. I also reinstated the Blue-Horn Award to honor staff for acts of kindness, further reinforcing a supportive and rewarding work environment.

My leadership has ***advanced research and funding*** at all levels. For example:

- At GSU, I secured a \$247,131 BOR grant to optimize clinical partnerships and experiential learning and subsequently submitted an additional \$513,000 proposal.
- I have also submitted proposals for a \$4 million state-funded mobile clinic project and a \$1.5 million earmark grant to address disparities in maternal health.

Previously, as Ph.D. Program Director, I secured \$248,000 in GEER II NSRP funding to support doctoral students. My experience in grant writing and resource acquisition will greatly benefit AU CON's relatively new Ph.D. program.

I have cultivated robust ***clinical and community partnerships*** with organizations such as Grady Health System, Piedmont, WellStar, and Children's Hospital of Atlanta (CHOA). These collaborations have supported clinical placements, scholarships, and mutually beneficial initiatives. Establishing the GSU School of Nursing Advisory Board further strengthened alumni and stakeholder engagement.

My leadership also reflects a deep commitment to health equity. For example, I led an initiative to address pregnancy-associated cardiovascular mortality among underserved African American women by developing a proposal for a mobile application to provide access to medical attention and advice.

Academic Qualification Overview

I earned a Bachelor of Science and a Master's degree in nursing from Seoul National University (SNU) in Seoul, South Korea, in 1985 and 1988, respectively. I then received a Ph.D. in Nursing with a Neuropsychology cognate from The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio, in 1999, followed by post-doctoral training supported by the Korean Research Foundation in 2000. I have had the honor of being inducted as a Fellow of the American Heart Association (FAHA) and a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing (FAAN), both recognizing excellence as a scholar, teacher, and clinician whose work has positively impacted people's lives.

I have developed my career in nursing practice, education, research, and leadership for nearly four decades; the past 25 years have been spent in faculty roles. I have had the privilege to experience and engage in diverse cultures. My faculty roles across various academic environments, such as universities and health science centers, have provided me with unique opportunities to establish leadership skills to serve institutional missions and goals. I have steadily progressed in my career, starting as a full-time lecturer and moving through ranks to associate professor and full professor. This progression has allowed me to develop a deep understanding of faculty roles and priorities across different tracks. I am grateful for the opportunities that helped me build leadership skills and support faculty in their lifetime career

development. I also have developed leadership skills through various roles within school, university, national and international organizations, and beyond. I have a profound understanding of the challenges facing nursing today and possess the vision to transform these challenges into opportunities by creating a collaborative environment, rewarding culture, and optimizing leadership for the future of nursing.

Research and Scholarship

My passion for research is deeply rooted in my clinical experience. After 10 years of clinical practice, I began my PhD in 1995. My doctoral study focused on gender disparity in cardiovascular health, specifically the impact of psychosocial factors on health outcomes after acute myocardial infarction. My research revealed that women experience anxiety to a greater extent, and this anxiety is associated with cardiac events six times more often in women than in men. Women delay seeking treatment for their cardiac symptoms longer than men, resulting in more extensive infarction and long-term disabilities. This research contributed to enhancing clinicians' awareness of women's vulnerability to anxiety through the American Association of Critical Care Nurses (AACN) annual conference and early publications in the 2000s.

During post-doctoral training, I expanded my scholarship to investigate how behavioral factors impact cardiovascular outcomes and then developed integrative intervention modalities to reduce risks among people at high risk of cardiovascular disease and stroke. Since then, the primary focus of my research has been on the biobehavioral risks of CVD and stroke in vulnerable subpopulations (e.g., women, people exposed to chronic stress, immigrants, cancer survivors, and their caregivers) and improving their cardiovascular health outcomes.

I have disseminated my research through 70 data-based peer-reviewed research papers, eight peer-reviewed journal reviews, and six book chapters. I have presented my research at more than 100 regional, national, and international scientific meetings. I have also been invited to be a keynote speaker at numerous international conferences and as a guest speaker at universities in China.

Among numerous regional and national recognitions, my dissertation, "Gender Differences in the Association between Anxiety Early after Acute Myocardial Infarction and In-hospital Complication," was awarded the AACN's mentorship award in 1998 and a Graduate Student Alumni Research Award in 1999. I also received the D. Jeanne Wood Nursing Scholarship Award by the Southern Nursing Research Society (SNRS) in 2014 for my study on "Cardiovascular risk among hurricane survivors."

In the last decade, I have expanded my research to address health disparities and highlight the impacts of social determinants on health outcomes among vulnerable populations, such as ethnic minorities, first-generation immigrants, and people with disabilities. I lead a writing group and mentor junior faculty interested in these topics, resulting in numerous publications and presentations.

I have served on the editorial boards for three nursing journals, reviewed manuscripts for numerous other journals, and been a grant reviewer for several organizations, including SNRS and Sigma Theta Tau.

Teaching and Mentoring

Throughout my career, I have used my research knowledge and skills in education to enhance students' learning in research methodology, interpreting research findings, and using published data. I incorporate high-priority research data into my courses, such as Foundations of Biobehavioral Research for Ph.D. students and Evidence-Based Practice for both undergraduate and master's students. By doing so, I have facilitated students' exposure to research early in their careers. As a result, numerous student posters have been presented at national scientific meetings.

I have expanded my mentoring for doctoral students from nursing to social psychology and MD-to-PhD students. I have used innovative approaches, such as hosting a writing group that any faculty or graduate student across the country can join virtually every Saturday. Through this group, I have mentored junior scholars with limited time, helping them amplify their scholarly outcomes (e.g., publications and grant submissions). The success of these writing groups has led to their adoption across the country.

Serving the Community with Passion

I have been actively involved in both scholarly and non-scholarly community services. I serve on the editorial boards of three journals, review manuscripts for more than eight journals, and have reviewed research grants for organizations such as the Southern Nursing Research Society, Sigma Theta Tau, and the American Nursing Foundation.

I have also worked to improve awareness of CVD and stroke, particularly in the Asian American immigrant population, which is often understudied despite being at risk. I developed health education materials in their native language to improve awareness of CVD and metabolic syndrome.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusivity

I have also strived to support diversity, equity, and inclusivity (DEI) in my leadership roles. In 2020-2021, I participated in the Southern Nursing Research Society (SNRS) Leadership Academy. As a final project, I led the leadership cohort to conduct an organizational analysis focusing on DEI. Through this, we recognized the presence of implicit bias and that health equity was vaguely defined.

I have continued to contribute to health equity through my research, including addressing social determinants of health among underserved cardio-oncology patients. I translated the Health Information National Trend Survey (HINTS) into Korean and conducted a multi-state survey on Korean immigrants with limited English proficiency, highlighting how linguistic disparity affects health literacy and access to cancer screening.

Looking Ahead

I am committed to fostering academic and clinical excellence, advancing innovative programs, and building collaborative relationships to elevate Auburn University College of Nursing (AU CON) to national prominence. With my experience and vision, I will lead with authenticity and drive, ensuring the College remains responsive to the evolving healthcare landscape while upholding its mission to prepare the next generation of nursing professionals.
