Notes:

ENGL1100 and 1120

All majors require ENGL 1100, English Composition I and ENGL 1120, English Composition II. All students must take them, and they do not count for any other Core requirements (i.e. they do not satisfy a Humanities requirement), so they are not on the chart for research.

History/Literature Sequence

Some majors require a history sequence (counting for 6 of the 12 required social science credit hours), some require a Literature sequence (counting for 6 of the 12 required Humanities credit hours), and some give you the choice to choose which sequence you'd like to take.

In addition to at least one history, some majors require specific social sciences, some require you to choose from a list of 2-3 specific courses, and for other majors it is a mixture or completely up to you to decide which you would like to take.

The same is true for Humanities. Every major requires one CORE Fine Arts (fewer than 10 majors require a specific Fine Art -- most let you choose) **and** at least one Literature course. The remaining credit hours of Humanities may be specified by major.
