**SPECIAL NOTE FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS PLANNING TO ENTER ARCHITECTURE AT AUBURN UNIVERSITY:**

The major in Architecture requires both studio and professional support courses to complete the degree. These courses are likely not offered at the community college level. Thus, courses taken beyond the 42 semester hours that are required in Areas I-IV, except for three (3) hours, will count only as free electives outside this major. Again, there are three (3) hours of free electives for this major.

Further, as a professional program, the desired entry term is summer. The summer semester serves as the competitive gateway for the selection process. If the student is selected, there are eight (8) required studio courses, one per semester. Each studio builds on the last. Thus, it will take at least nine (9) semesters to graduate upon transfer.

The remaining hours in AREA V must be fulfilled by the requirements at Auburn University. Courses taken at Auburn University will likely qualify for reverse transfer to the community college to complete the Associate Degree requirements.

Last, an option for a concurrent degree in Interior Architecture is a possibility once a student matriculates to Auburn. Students apply for admission to the Interior Architecture Program during their second year of the Professional Architecture program. If accepted into the Interior Architecture Program, the student pursues both the Bachelor of Architecture and Bachelor of Interior Architecture as concurrent degrees (5 years plus one summer of study).
