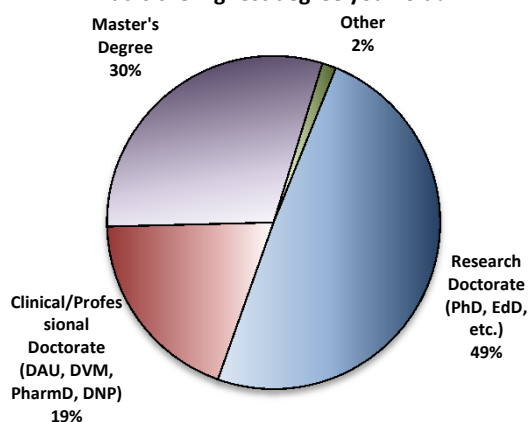

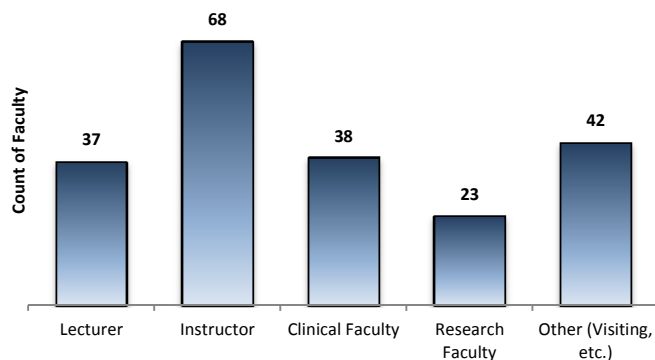

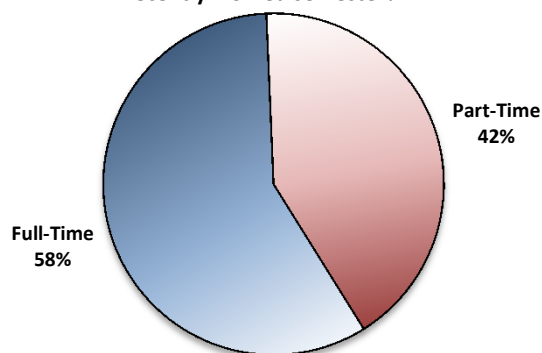
What is the highest degree you hold?



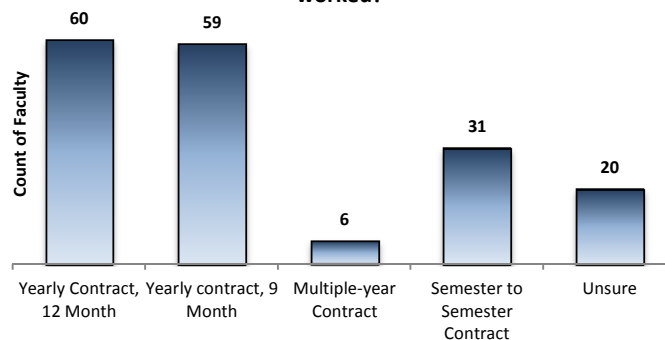

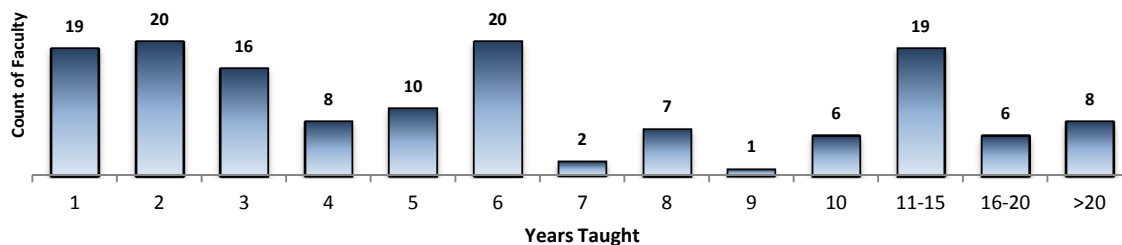

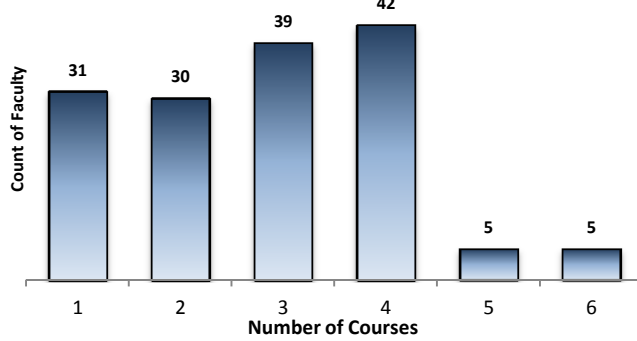

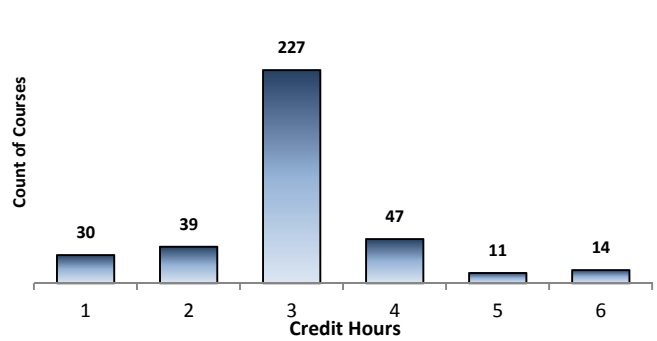

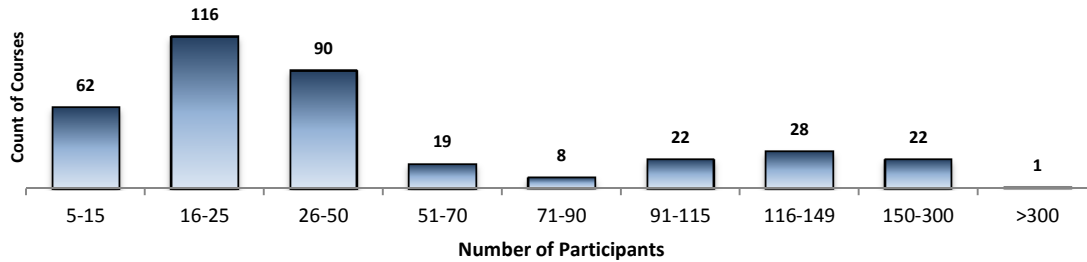
