

YOU'RE GOING TO NEED THEM TO ROLL TOOMER'S CORNER.

### WHEN WE DO IT:

When we win, we go to the corner of College Street and Magnolia Avenue. Then we toss rolls of toilet paper and cover the oaks. We've done it for decades. USA TODAY named it **THE NATION'S**BEST SPORTS TRADITION.

### WHY WE DO IT:

The story most accepted to be true says (way back when) Toomer's Drugs was home to the city's only telegraph. Wins would be telegraphed back to Toomer's from the road. To alert the town, the drug store threw ticker tape over the power lines.

The rest is, well...tradition.

### **HOW WE DO IT:**

Go back and forth over the branches until you've made a snow of pure white toilet paper. Everybody's got a different technique. Let your roll fly.

# FIND YOUR PLACE IN THE AUBURN FAMILY.

- 1. QUAD CENTER: Welcome to the center of campus. You'll find the Office of Undergraduate Admissions here. The Quad is home to 10 of Auburn's most historic residence halls and nearly 1,000 students. Quad rooms are all suite-style (two double-occupancy rooms + a bathroom).
- 2. HAROLD D. MELTON STUDENT CENTER: It's three stories of food and the offices of Student Affairs, Student Involvement, Greek Life and Parent & Family Programs. You'll find study areas, printing stations and a game room. If you want to experience the "real" Auburn, this is where it lives.
- **3. HALEY CENTER:** It's home to the **College of Education**. The Concourse is the pedestrian walkway in front of Haley. Each Wednesday, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., student organizations host "O-Days" or Organization Days, where students hear from student leaders about ways to get involved.
- 4. CORNER OF TIGER AND THACH CONCOURSE: This is where you go when you're ravenous. It's food truck central. When you're full, head over to Thach and Tichenor Halls home base for the College of Liberal Arts and the School of Communication and Journalism.

FYI: Auburn's School of Communication is ranked in the NATION'S TOP 30.

- 5. BROWN-KOPEL ENGINEERING STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT CENTER: This is the College of Engineering. Built in 2019, there are classrooms, student study spaces, a design and innovation center, wind-tunnel laboratory, shops and plenty of project incubators to hatch your ideas.
- **6. HORTON-HARDGRAVE HALL AND LOWDER HALL:** Horton-Hardgrave Hall opened in 2019 for undergraduate and graduate business students. The rooftop terrace has some of the best views on campus, innovation labs, team rooms, indoor and even outdoor collaboration space and classrooms.

**FYI:** Auburn's Harbert College of Business is AACSB-accredited. Fewer than 5% of biz schools in the

**Lowder Hall** is where you go for academic advising, the Office of Professional and Career Development, recruitment office and tech labs.

 FOY & CATER HALL: Foy Hall is home to the First-Year-Experience Office, Study Abroad, Veterans Affairs, Tiger Card, Campus Dining and Auburn Global. It's also the locale of an all-you-care-to-eat dining facility.

Opposite Foy Hall is **Katharine Cooper Cater Hall**, home to the Honors College and educational support services. Auburn's "call-outs" take place here. That's when organizations announce new members on the back steps.

FYI: During exams, SGA brings in puppies to Cater Lawn to help students destress.

**8. SAMFORD HALL:** Yes, *the* Samford Hall of Auburn. Our most iconic building and where all the action is. Built in 1859 (and known as Old Main), it burned in 1887. Auburn architects and engineers rebuilt it adding sand to the building to prevent a fire. This is where you'll find the president's office.

FYI: The clock tower at Samford Hall chimes the Auburn fight song every day at noon.






9. TOOMER'S CORNER: This is where the university meets the city of Auburn. Try the lemonade. Southern Living says it's one of the Top 100 Things to Do Before you Die. After an Auburn win, we head to Toomer's Corner to roll the oaks with toilet paper.

- **10. MARY MARTIN HALL:** Auburn's first library and the first building to get electricity. It's now the place for Student Financial Services, the Career Center, the Exploratory Advising Center and the Office of University Scholarships.
- 11. MELL CLASSROOM BUILDING & RALPH BROWN DRAUGHON (RBD) LIBRARY: It's technology, active learning classrooms, lecture halls and food to keep you at the top of your brain game. The library entrance is inside Mell and is home to millions of volumes, the Miller Writing Center, the Digital Resource Lab and student support services.
- 12. SCIENCE CENTER CONCOURSE: This area is known as the science center concourse because of its proximity to the College of Sciences and Mathematics. The large building is the science center laboratories, and the two smaller buildings to the right are the science center auditorium and the science center classrooms. You'll also find the chemistry building and Parker Hall home to the math department.



You'll also find **Dudley Hall** — home to the College of Architecture, Design and Construction. The lights are almost always on because great ideas can come at any time. The College of Architecture, Design and Construction is open 24 hours a day to students in the School of Architecture, Planning and Landscape Architecture (APLA). The recently renovated studios are housed in Dudley Hall and are flooded with glorious natural light. **The Miller-Gorrie Center** is home to the Department of Building Science.

FYI: Our College of Architecture, Design and Construction is nationally ranked.

- **13. LEACH SCIENCE CENTER:** The Leach Science Center addition, located above the hill of the COSAM buildings, houses classrooms and laboratories for science and math students.
- 14. COMER HALL: This is the College of Agriculture and where you'll find the Department of Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology. The interior of this building is done entirely in Alabama native wood (circa 1922).
  FYI: People call Comer Hall "Ag Hill."
- **15. THE HILL:** 12 suite-style residence halls are on The Hill including **Terrell Hall**.
- **16. VILLAGE HOUSING AND DINING:** Eight residence halls set up as super-suites (four private bedrooms, two shared bathrooms and a common living/kitchenette area) + dining hall and convenience store. **Auburn's 18 social sororities** take up three buildings and a fourth houses members of the Honors College. The remaining four buildings are **coed housing** for both freshmen and upperclassmen.
- **17. NURSING BUILDING:** This state-of-the-art facility is at the corner of Lem Morrison Drive and Donahue Drive. Inside you'll find a tiered auditorium, active learning classrooms, a skills lab, a nursing simulation suite, a student lounge and more.
- **18. AUBURN ARENA:** It has capacity for 9,600 screaming fans. **The Jungle** is the official student section of Auburn Men's Basketball. The student section is located courtside and provides **one of the best home-court advantages in the country**.
- **19. SPIDLE HALL:** Home to the College of Human Sciences, including majors in event management, apparel merchandising, nutrition, culinary sciences and more.

**Opening spring 2022:** The Tony and Libba Rane Culinary Science Center will include an open-air market to sample student work, lab and classroom space, a boutique hotel run by hotel and restaurant management students and a rooftop event space for Event Management Students to create events.

- **20. THE SEAL:** In front of Langdon Hall, you'll find the words, "Research, Instruction, Extension; for the advancement of science and art." Rumor has it that if you step on the seal prior to graduation, you won't graduate on time or find your true love at Auburn.
- **21. CENTENNIAL GARDENS:** The gardens were named to commemorate the first 100 years of our institution. This was also **Auburn's first football field**. The fountain marks center field. The first home game was played in 1896 against Georgia Tech. We won 45-0. Not that we're still keeping score...
- **22. RECREATION AND WELLNESS CENTER:** The unofficial campus hub has more than 240,000 square feet of recreational space including an indoor walking/running track, six regulation-size basketball courts, a 200,000-gallon outdoor leisure pool and hot tub (in the shape of a tiger's paw), rock-climbing walls, racquetball courts, sand volleyball courts and more.

FYI: The Princeton Review ranked it #1 for Best Recreational Facilities in 2021.

23. SOUTH DONAHUE RESIDENCE HALL AND WELLNESS KITCHEN: This housing is "super-suite" style (includes a washer and dryer in each suite, wall-mounted flat screen TV in the living room, queen-sized beds, quartz countertops and tiled bathrooms and showers).

The **Wellness Kitchen** offers all-you-care-to-eat dining with a pizza oven, a carving station, a hot line with fresh meats and vegetables, a salad bar and a smoothie station. It can accommodate special dietary needs and even has a separate allergy kitchen for food prep.

- **24. FORESTRY AND WILDLIFE SCIENCES BUILDING:** Home to all academic advising offices, classrooms and laboratory facilities for students to utilize in their research.
- **25. GOODWIN HALL:** Find your beat here with the music department. A 2020 addition boasts a rehearsal space large enough for the 380-member marching band.
- **26. CAMPUS GREEN SPACE AND JORDAN-HARE STADIUM:** Football magic happens here. The Campus Green Space is home to events and gatherings throughout the week and is home to Auburn Football tailgating on game day weekends. **Jordan-Hare Stadium** swells and becomes the fifth largest city in Alabama on game day.
