

DEFERRED NEXT STEPS



The Auburn admissions process involves a comprehensive review, considering academic achievements, extracurricular involvement, leadership qualities, and other factors. At this stage, we would like to gather additional information to help us make a final decision. With the demand for an Auburn degree at an all-time high, the number of applicants exceeds our capacity, but provides an opportunity for an expanded review to identify students with both promise and potential to be successful members of the Auburn Family.

Receiving a deferral does not signify the end of your application journey. Although we cannot offer admission at this stage, your application remains under consideration. You have the opportunity to enhance your application by submitting an updated high school transcript and/or new test scores for further evaluation. We will conduct a more in-depth review and encourage you to provide additional information.

WHAT IS THE OPTIONAL SUPPORTING STATEMENT?

In our review process, applicants can provide extra details for consideration. The optional supporting statement lets you share your experiences and give context to your academic history and major interests. This helps us assess your grade trends, high school courses, and test scores, as well as your passion and readiness for a specific field of study and your connection to Auburn University concerning your academic and post-graduation goals. Keep in mind the optional supporting statement, limited to 150 words, is assessed along with your academic readiness. While significant, it isn't the sole factor in determining admission or financial aid awards.

WHAT CAN YOU DO WHILE YOU WAIT FOR YOUR FINAL DECISION?

- » Log into the applicant portal at aub.ie/applicantportal to view additional items added to your checklist.
- » Upload a copy of your mid-year transcript. We would like to see your fall senior semester grades.
- » Submit the Optional Supporting Statement Form.
- » Check that we have received your highest official test score.

WILL ATTENDING A CAMPUS TOUR HELP MY CHANCES OF BEING ACCEPTED?

No, Auburn University does not consider campus tour attendance in the admissions review process.

WILL MEETING WITH MY ADMISSIONS ADVISOR IMPROVE MY ACCEPTANCE CHANCES?

No, Auburn University does not conduct interviews as part of the admissions review process.

WILL CHANGING MY MAJOR HELP?

Admission to Auburn University is determined through the general university admissions process. You should submit your application for the specific major you intend to pursue.

CAN I CHANGE MY APPLICATION TO TEST-OPTIONAL OR WITH A TEST SCORE?

No, since you have received an admission decision, your chosen application pathway is confirmed and cannot be changed.

WHEN WILL I RECEIVE MY FINAL DECISION?

Deferred applicants will receive a final decision in early March.
