

# Why should I self-report a positive COVID-19 test result?

**Reporting helps Auburn help those affected and safeguard campus health.**

To ensure that Auburn University can provide information and resources to members of our campus community who have tested positive for COVID-19, the University requires students, faculty and staff to complete the [Self-Report Form](#). This information will assist the [COVID Resource Center](#) and public health officials with monitoring the incidence of cases occurring in our community.

## **+ Self-reporting is an essential step to help safeguard the health of the campus community.**

- If you are diagnosed with COVID-19, you should notify your close contacts that you have tested positive for COVID-19.
- By allowing the university to track COVID-19 cases on campus, we can reduce exposure to others on campus and provide students and employees needed services and follow-up care.

## **+ Your information is always kept confidential.**

- We are committed to ensuring that your submission remains confidential and will only be used to provide support and resources.

## **+ Students are required to self-report.**

- Self-reporting positive COVID-19 test results through the online form is required. Students who test positive and do not complete the Self-Report Form may be referred to Student Conduct for potential disciplinary action.
- Regardless of where students choose to be tested, in the Auburn area or elsewhere, it is imperative that all AU students who receive positive Covid-19 test results comply by completing the form.
