Why should I self-report a positive COVID-19 test result?

Reporting helps Auburn help those affected and safeguard campus health.

To ensure that Auburn University can provide information and resources to members of our campus community who have tested positive for COVID-19, the University requires students, faculty and staff to complete the <u>Self-Report Form</u>. This information will assist the <u>COVID Resource Center</u> and public health officials with monitoring the incidence of cases occurring in our community.

Self-reporting is an essential step to help safeguard the health of the campus community.

- If you are diagnosed with COVID-19, you should notify your close contacts that you have tested positive for COVID-19.
- By allowing the university to track COVID-19 cases on campus, we can reduce exposure to others on campus and provide students and employees needed services and follow-up care.

+ Your information is always kept confidential.

 We are committed to ensuring that your submission remains confidential and will only be used to provide support and resources.

+ Students are required to self-report.

- Self-reporting positive COVID-19 test results through the online form is required. <u>Students who test positive and do not complete the Self-Report Form may be referred to Student Conduct for potential disciplinary action.</u>
- Regardless of where students choose to be tested, in the Auburn area or elsewhere, it
 is imperative that all AU students who receive positive Covid-19 test results comply by
 completing the form.
