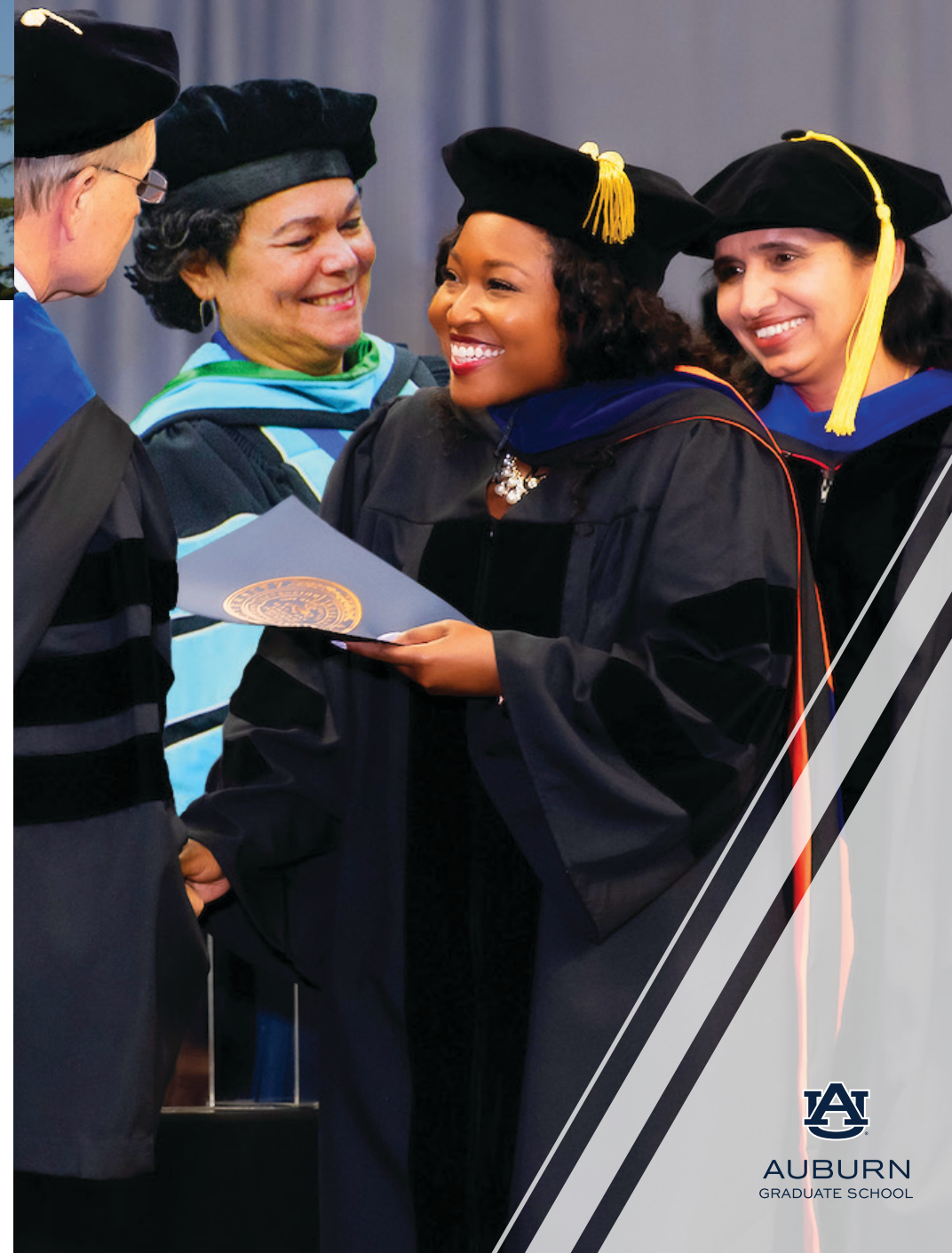

Auburn provides many graduate **student support services**, including academic resources such as the AU Libraries, the Miller Writing Center, and the Biggio Center for the Enhancement of Teaching and Learning.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Auburn University offers funding resources that provide tuition savings and stipend support that put your goals within reach. About **one-third of all graduate students** at Auburn University receive some form of a **graduate assistantship**, typically awarded by the home academic department and based on merit.

External funding options like **fellowships**, **scholarships**, **grants**, and **loans** also help make graduate school affordable. The AU Graduate School supports top incoming Ph.D. students through the **Presidential Graduate Fellowship** program.
