

Course Accessibility Quick Check

Syllabus

- My syllabus is available in an accessible electronic format.
 - Microsoft Word or Pages documents tagged with “Styles”.
 - My PDFs were OCR'd, Tagged, and reading order was checked.

- I have included an “Accommodation Statement” informing the student how to request accommodations in my course.

Handouts

- My handouts or course materials are available in an accessible electronic format.
 - Microsoft Word or Pages documents tagged with “Styles”.
 - My PDFs were OCR'd, Tagged, and reading order was checked.

Presentation

- My presentations, such as PowerPoints, are available in an accessible electronic format.
 - If using Microsoft PowerPoint 10 or later, the built-in accessibility checker has been run.
 - I have provided descriptions for all important images.
 - When I switch to Outline view, all the text from the slides appear.

Videos

- My video materials (DVDs, video podcast, online video resources) have closed captioning/subtitles or I have provided a transcript for the video materials.

Audio

- My audio materials (CDs, audio podcast, clips or other audio formats) are provided with an accompanying transcript.

- I have added an appropriate **Alt** attribute and/or captioning to all images.

Online Materials

- The online resources I use in my class are accessible to all students.
 - I have avoided Flash content
 - I have checked to see if the videos were captioned or a transcript was available
 - For websites I am unsure about its accessibility, I have contacted the Office of Accessibility.

Screen Reader Friendly Wording

- I have avoided wording such as “click here” or “select this” used on my webpages or LMS.
- I have avoided abbreviations when possible.
- I have used specific titles for assignments such as “Week One Assignment” instead of more generic terms such as “Weekly Assignments”.
