The Auburn University Early Learning Center is accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children. The Auburn University Early Learning Center supports the instructional and research programs of the Department of Human Development and Family Studies. It provides students and faculty an opportunity for child and family study through observation, case study, and research. Preschool children are observed frequently, and the children and their families may be called upon to cooperate in case studies and research projects. Parents may be requested to reinforce their children's school activities with learning experiences in the home or asked to participate in parent education programs. The three-fold function of the Center, the <u>training</u> of students, child and family <u>research</u>, and service to you, your child, and the community requires your full participation in the program.

Parents agree to cooperate in service, training, and research programs of the Auburn University Early Learning Center and understand that enrollment in future years could be contingent on participation in most phases of the program including research. They are urged to discuss any problems or concerns with the Auburn University Early Learning Center Director so that the needs of the Center and those of families can be met.

Applications are accepted beginning October 1 for the next academic year. We begin selecting children for groups February 1 but the process generally takes about 3 weeks. To meet the needs of faculty and students, we try to maintain a balanced child population, including children from varied social, cultural, and economic backgrounds and a rough equivalence of boys and girls. In selecting children for the program we consider these factors in addition to the child's age and the date of application. Priority will be given to previously enrolled children and siblings and children attending both am and pm sessions. If your child is selected for admission to the program, you will be informed in writing and asked to pay a part of the fall tuition in advance as a **NONREFUNDABLE** deposit. There is no guarantee of continued enrollment in subsequent years, although every effort is made to continue enrollment if possible. Applications of children who are not selected during the initial selection process are placed in a waiting pool. When a child withdraws from the Center, or if a family does not accept the initial offer of a slot, we try to find a child similar to the withdrawing child (e.g., same sex and age). Thus, because of our population requirements, it is impossible to compile a prioritized waiting list.

Children must be 3 years old by September 1 and toilet trained in order to participate in the program. Children are welcome to participate in both a morning and afternoon program. Care must be provided by a parent or babysitter provided by the parent between 11:30 and 12:30.

<u>Please refer to the proposed schedule of groups in the upper left hand of the application and check which class you prefer.</u> Ages, times, and fees are determined on an annual basis to meet the research, instructional, and budgetary needs of the Department of Human Development and Family Studies. Further parental responsibilities include submission of:

- -Alabama Certificate of Immunization
- -Intake questionnaire and required forms packet to be completed by parents as part of the admission process
