



• What Did WE Do!



Recommendations

• Eliminate partridge pea in your native warm season grass planting mix.

• Rotary mow during late spring to early summer to control overtopping and to inhibit reseeding.

• Scalp along the existing rows.

- Plant early Prior to February 15th
 - Open the stand up to allow air movement







Control

- April 28, 2011
 - Cost share approved for the control of partridge pea.
 - Natural Resource Conservation Service

- Transline (Broadcast or Band Spraying)
 - April Mid June
 - Milestone Used when available

- Milestone Field Trails
 - Mark Hainds, Longleaf Alliance, Research Coordinator
 - Results at end of summer



Control

- Rotary Mowing
 - When Partridge Pea reaches 2 -3 feet
 - Prevent Seeding
 - Natural Resource Conservation Service
