SACSCOC Criteria for QEP Project:


- 1. Emerges from a participatory process
- 2. Based on institutional assessment and mission
- 3. Has a significant impact on student learning
- 4. Demonstrates institution's ability to plan and execute a project
- 5. Includes assessment of student learning and impact of project

How we chose the topic:

- EXPLORATORY COMMITTEE identified possible topics, solicited proposals and made recommendations to senior leadership
- 2. DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE reviewed research and other models, focused on Professional ePortfolios, refined student learning outcomes, designed implementation, involved potential adopters, solicited comments on drafts

What are Professional ePortfolios?

- Websites created by individuals to:
 - Synthesize learning experiences
 - Showcase skills and abilities

 Purposefully selected and arranged for an audience of the student's choosing




What are Professional ePortfolios?

Why Professional ePortfolios?

SHOWCASE SKILLS:

• Students have expressed interest in showcasing their skills at graduation





Why Professional ePortfolios?

Provides a Real Audience:

Programs have expressed interest in expanding existing capstone or senior projects, involving industry advisors, and responding to expectations of their disciplines

Who can participate?

- Any program, department, or college that wants to add a Professional ePortfolio requirement and embed into curriculum
- Any faculty member who wants to use ePortfolio in courses to enhance student learning
- Any student who wants to create a Professional ePortfolio to represent their learning to others





What will we do?

- 1. Develop infrastructure to support students, faculty and programs
- 2. Support student learning through expansion of support and increased co-curricular activities
- 3. Support faculty in developing and extending curriculum, mentoring students, and connecting ePortfolios to teaching and research



Stages of Development




Identify first adopters
