Committee (TEC)

### **Basis for Questions**

- Current SET questions were thought up by the TEC based on historical questions and logical input
- Basis for proposed questions come from research on undergraduate education
  - Chickering, A.W. and Z.F. Gamson. 1987. Seven principles for good practice in undergraduate education. American Association for Higher Education Bulletin, March, 1987.

### **Principle**

 Instructor encourages contact between students and faculty

#### Question

 The instructor encouraged me to interact with them regarding course content (electronically, during office hours, in class, etc.).

### **Principle**

 Instructor develops reciprocity and cooperation among students

#### Question

 The instructor provided opportunities for me to cooperate with other classmates about course a material (electronically, inside or outside of class, etc.).

### **Principle**

 Instructor communicates high expectations

#### Question

 The instructor communicated high expectations for my work in this course.

### **Principle**

 Instructor provides prompt feedback

#### Question

 The instructor provided me with an evaluations of my academic progress at regular intervals during the semester.

### **Principle**

 Instructor emphasizes time on task

#### Question

 The instructor provided me ample opportunities to develop, apply, and demonstrate my learning in this course.

### **Principle**

 Instructor encourages active learning

#### Question

 The instructor prompted me to think analytically and critically about the course material.

### **Principle**

 Instructor respects diverse talents and ways of learning

#### Question

 The instructor provided an environment that encouraged me and supported my learning.

### **Final Question**

- Please provide additional feedback to improve future instruction (strengths or areas needing improvement).
  - Open ended question

### Use of SETs

- Due to a variety of factors, SETs should not be used in a summative manner
  - They are not (and cannot be) a good measure of the absolute quality of teaching.
- SETs are most useful for evaluating teaching in a formative way
  - How can teaching or course material be improved

### Future plans

  - Examine how SETs are used at Auburn University
  - Examine how SETs are used at other SEC schools
  - Examine the research on how SETs should be used
